- 1. PURPOSE** — The general purpose of the Bulletin is to further the objectives of IPIC, which are to:
 - a) represent the interests of Canadian intellectual property practitioners;
 - b) influence the development of intellectual property laws to the extent they impact intellectual property matters in Canada;
 - c) be the recognized and visible authority on Canadian intellectual property law and practice;
 - d) ensure high levels of knowledge, training, and ethics in Canadian intellectual property practitioners; and
 - e) increase the level of intellectual property business in the Canadian economy.
- 2. SELECTION OF ARTICLES – FIRST PRIORITY** — IPIC works towards its objectives through the activities of the President and Council, the various committees, and the Executive Director and staff. In keeping with its general purpose, the Bulletin is primarily a means for these parties to distribute information to the IPIC membership.
- 3. SELECTION OF ARTICLES – CIPO** — Articles and notices received from the Canadian Intellectual Property Office are also routinely published in the Bulletin, as they usually relate to the core areas of professional competence of IPIC members.
- 4. SELECTION OF ARTICLES – OTHER** — Submissions received from others will, subject to space constraints, be published in the Bulletin if they are seen to further the objectives of IPIC. Articles about intellectual property law developments in foreign jurisdictions will be published only if they are relevant to IPIC's objectives and of interest to its members. Articles dealing with the international harmonization of intellectual property laws are likely to be published, particularly if they discuss developments that will affect Canada and/or Canada has been involved in the harmonization efforts.

Priority will be given to articles submitted by IPIC members over non-members. An article dealing with subject matter in the area of interest of an IPIC committee may be referred by the Bulletin Committee to the chair of the committee to ensure that the article does not conflict with the work of the committee. It is recommended that an author contemplating submitting such an article, discuss the article with the relevant committee chair prior to its preparation.
- 5. OBJECTIVITY** — Practitioners involved as advocates in specific cases may not author articles about such cases for submission to *The Bulletin*, unless approved of the Bulletin Committee.
- 6. BY-LINES** — Authors must provide a byline with their article that includes their full name, company / firm name or government department, city, province and country (if not Canada). Acknowledgements should contain the same information as that for authors.
- 7. STYLE GUIDELINES AND CITATION STANDARDS** — Authors will also be required to comply with size restrictions, style guidelines, citation standards and other requirements that may be established by the Bulletin Committee to ensure the quality of the Bulletin.
- 8. COPYRIGHT** — Copyright in submissions to IPIC for reproduction in *The Bulletin* shall remain that of the author, subject to IPIC's right to edit for space, style and clarity as IPIC deems appropriate, and also subject to IPIC's right to use, reproduce, publish, republish, distribute, store and archive all such submissions in whole or in part, in any form or medium whatsoever, without notice or compensation of any kind to the author, although IPIC will ensure that credit ensues to the original author and that any editing will not intentionally result in amending the original intent of the author.
- 9. EDITING** — All articles are subject to editing and IPIC may revise any article without notice to or prior approval from the author.
- 10. AGREEMENT** — The author of an article for the Bulletin shall provide an executed agreement regarding the provisions set out in articles 8 and 9 in a form as established by the Bulletin Committee from time to time.
